MESSAGE FROM MAYOR LENARD KWASNY

Three candidates have been nominated for the one vacant Councillor position, therefore a by-election will take place on September 11, 2023. During this vote there will also be a non-binding question for residents "Are you in favour of the Town of Onoway conducting a forensic audit?". There will be 2 opportunities for advance voting. Council has declared September 18-24, 2023 as Rail Safety Week. CN asked Council to declare the Week in order to raise awareness, save lives and prevent injuries on the tracks in our municipality. I was surprised to learn that, in 2022 in Canada, there were 66 fatalities and 43 serious injuries that were all avoidable – caused due to crossing and trespassing incidents on train tracks.

Our office recognizes Truth and Reconciliation Day which is September 30 (statutory day is Monday, October 2). This day provides an opportunity for each employee to recognize and commemorate the legacy of residential schools. Staff use it as day of quiet reflection or participation in a community event.


In order to vote, your name must appear on the list of electors, if any, and if your name does not appear on the list of electors, the person vouching for you must produce identification for inspection. If there is no list of electors, you must produce identification for inspection. The identification must be one or more of acceptable forms of identification including government issued picture ID showing the elector's name and current address (i.e. Operator/Driver's License or Government photo identification - for non-drivers), or one piece of identification authorized by the Chief Electoral Officer (must establish the elector's name and current address to prove resident requirement) as required by section 53 of the *Local Authorities Election Act*.



BY-ELECTION QUESTION

ARE YOU IN FAVOUR OF THE TOWN OF ONOWAY CONDUCTING A FORENSIC AUDIT?

WHAT DOES NON-BINDING MEAN?

Municipal Government Act
Vote of Electors - General Provisions

Electors to vote on a question 236 (1) A council may provide for the submission of a question to be voted on by the electors on any matter over which the municipality has jurisdiction.

(2) A vote of the electors under subsection (1) does not bind council.

The Municipal Government Act details that the question does not bind council. While the question is being asked, and a response from the residents is requested. Council may, or may not choose to conduct a forensic audit.

WHY IS THE TOWN OF ONOWAY PROPOSING A FORENSIC AUDIT?

A group of citizens has published in the Lac Ste Anne Bulletin their wish to request a forensic audit. As the Council of the Town of Onoway is here to serve the Community, the question is being proposed to receive feedback from the residents.

WHAT IS A FORENSIC AUDIT?

A forensic audit is an examination of financial records to find and/or investigate illegal financial activity.

The Town of Onoway conducts a financial audit every year, which includes the examination of a sample of transactions.

A forensic audit would require parameters to review in depth. That may be materials, supplies, wages and benefits, contract payments, fuel or other items. It would not be a full review of each transaction.

The next parameter would be how many years the audit would review.

WHAT IS THE COST OF A FORENSIC AUDIT?

The Town of Onoway pays approximately \$16,000 for an annual audit, which is a sample of financial transactions. Depending on the parameters set and number of years to be included. The forensic audit can be quite costly. This amount is unknown at this time however it may be \$40,000 or more.

Administration would review the financial requirement to fund a forensic audit and present options to council.
